

Smriti Rana is the Head of the WHO Collaborating Centre for Training and Policy on Access to Pain Relief in Trivandrum. This is the flagship service delivery program of Pallium India - an organization that demonstrates, educates and advocates for integrating palliative care into mainstream healthcare in India. Pallium India has Consultative Status with the UN Economic and Social Council.

Smriti has 2 decades of experience in palliative care with deep personal ties to her work. She has been the primary caregiver for family members with interstitial lung disease, cancer, bipolarity and addiction.
